Charter School Site Visit

CSD will be conducting their site visit on April 27, 2016. NMSA staff is working to begin collecting the appropriate documentation to share.

Health and Safety Visit

NMSA had a small problem with rodents (mice) and cockroaches during the months of January and February. We have increased the number of service call from the pest control provider an increased the intensity of the treatments. Additionally we have asked for a quote for them to come in an seal all possible holes by which mice enter. Joey is also replacing a weather strip on one of the cafeteria doors in order to eliminate the space between the door and the floor. The inspector left a report and felt that we had sufficiently addressed the problem. We will forward pictures of the repairs and copies of invoices to the inspector as evidenced that we have and continue to address all problems.

During her visit, lunch was delivered. She had concerns about the lunch provider's approval to deliver hot lunches. Mr. Garcia was called to the school to address the concerns immediately in order to avoid a shutting down of the operations.

We have also made the following changes to our procedures to ensure the best possible kitchen services. A light bulb was replaced, a service call has been placed to the dishwasher vendor so that the rinse cycle is automatic rather than manual, PH strips have been ordered, a rinse cycle ph log has been created, and a food temperature log has been created. NMSA will monitor the ph level several times throughout the week and food temperature almost daily to show that we are following all procedures. The logs will be scanned and forwarded to the inspector as evidenced that we have processes in place to ensure food safety requirements are met.

Additionally the stucco in that area needs to be repaired. That estimate is not available. Finally a plumbing problem in the boy's restroom requires attention. The estimate is \$1500.00. For any incident that cannot be linked to a prior problem, NMSA will need to pay the first \$4000.00 for every incident
