Evaluation

All elements of the NMTeach evaluation system were submitted to PED by the May 31 deadline. PED has announced that test scores (Value Added Score) will not be included in the 2018-2019 summative teacher evaluations.

Assessment & Accountability

- PED has announced that its intent to use either SAT or ACT as the high school accountability assessment for math and English language arts.
- Preliminary scores for the 2019 Transition Standards Based Assessment for Math and English Language Arts (formerly known as PARCC) have been received. Formal score reports will be available in July.
- PED has not yet decided whether the 2018-2019 school report card will follow the new "dashboard" model or continue with the school grade one last time.

Excellent Schools New Mexico/Transcend

The school is applying for a grant for follow-on funding to continue the work begun with Transcend.

Creative Writing & Literature

The Creative Writing & Literature department has admitted 18 incoming 9th-graders. Two more candidates are being auditioned.

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School Lunch Program

The school lunch program's operating cost for May was \$549. Overall, the running operating cost for the program year-to-date is \$4345.

Professional Development

Thanks to the support of the Stranahan Foundation, several staff members will be attending the Exeter Summer Institute (Xinrong Li, Rebekah Morgan, Bernadette Peña, Chasity Anderson, Denise Hinson).

Move

Most contents of the building are now packed. Student desks/chairs and lockers will be given to the Pecos school district. The Parent Association will hold a sale of remaining items. The physical move will occur in mid-July.

Furniture

A finalized order was submitted; the total cost stayed within the original budget. Delivery and installation will occur between July 15-August 6.

Facilities

The school staff, with support from Slate Stern, completed a pre-exit walkthrough with the Cathedral staff to agree on the details of the school's departure from 275 E. Alameda.
