School Closure and COVID-19 Response

- We are preparing instructional and operational plans for all possible scenarios, ranging from "regular opening", to various hybrid models, to all-online.
- The Secretary's School Re-Entry Task Force will issue their recommendations in about 10 days. We expect these to be guideposts, and for there to be significant local decisions to be made.

Legislative/PED/PEC

- The Charter Schools Division team will address the rescheduling of this year's monitoring site visit in June. In the meantime, we will upload everything that can be provided through Web-EPSS, including year-end data.

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• NMSA's allocation of CARES Act federal funding is about \$15,000 total for FY20 and FY2021. It will be used for student boot camp, PPE, and cleaning supplies/services.
