School Re-Entry Update

- 222 students (80%) of students are attending school on campus.
- Our seniors, with lots of support from Chelamia Quintana and the student support team, are all on track to graduate.
- We have not had any COVID-positive cases reported among our students and staff since reentry on April 5; we remain prepared to follow NMPED guidelines in the event that there is a COVID-positive case.
- NM Department of Health is providing a vaccine clinic at NMSA on Thursday, May 20. It is open to the public, and the Pfizer vaccine will be provided to those 12+.
- The Senior Recognition Assembly was held with seniors in person.

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• Graduation will be held with capacity restrictions at the Santa Fe Convention Center at 12:00 p.m., Friday, May 28. Bill Beacham will represent the Governing Council and Carl Thoma will represent the Board of Trustees.

Legislative/PED/PEC

- Charter Schools Division conducted an abbreviated virtual site visit on May 5. Thank you to Michael Kaplan for representing the Governing Council.
- NMSA notified PED that the school will not be participating in the ELTP (extended school year) program. The impacts on learning of the COVID year will be addressed through acceleration during our regular school calendar and school day, which already exceeds statutory minimums by 161 hours.
- Title I and Title II applications have been submitted to PED. Title IV and IDEA-B applications will be submitted by their respective deadlines.

Culturally & Linguistically Responsive Instruction

- The Western Educational Equity Assistance Center provided its first training to our Equity Leadership Team in May.
- Chelamia Quintana is leading a project to use our SEL grant through PED to support training in restorative justice practices.

Safety

• Since April 5, we have conducted two fire drills, an evacuation drill, and a shelter-in-place (including active shooter threat) drill.

Staffing

• We are currently hiring for math, science, and social studies/language arts in order to fill positions being vacated by departing faculty and to address the growth in enrollment for 2021-2022.
