Although the lyrics were originally written for a different tune, Weatherly's sister modified them, in 1913, to fit Londonderry Air (Irish diaspora anthem : irish emigrants and their descendants in countries such as the United Kingdom, the United States, Canada, Australia, Argentina, New Zealand, Mexico, South Africa, Brazil and states of the Caribbean and c...
